BACKGROUND

p55γ (Protein of 55 kDa, γ subunit; also PI 3-Kinase regulatory subunit γ and p55^{PIK}) is a 55-57 kDa member of the PI 3K p85 family of regulatory subunits. It is widely expressed and serves as a recruitment subunit for the p110 catalytic subunit of PI 3-Kinase. p55γ/p55^{PIK} should not be confused with the 55 kDa alpha splice variant of the p85α gene (75% amino acid [aa] identity). Human p55γ is 461 aa in length and contains a unique 34 aa N-terminus that binds Rb and prevents cycle progression, followed by a Pro-rich region (aa 35-44) and two SH2 domains that bind the p110 catalytic subunit (aa 65-160 and 358-452).
