BACKGROUND

RFC1 (Replication factor C subunit 1; also RFC140) is a 140-150 kDa, ubiquitously expressed member of the activator 1 large subunit family of proteins. It is one of five RFC complex subunits that participate in the early stages of DNA replication. Following the initiation of DNA synthesis by polα/primase, an RFC complex displaces polα at the replication fork, and recruits a PCNA homotrimeric complex to this site. This interacts with polδ to extend the newly-formed DNA strand. Human RFC1 is 1148 amino acids (aa) in length. It contains a phosphorylated-DNA binding region (aa 366-477), a PCNA binding domain (aa 478-712), an ATPase site (aa 643-772), and an NLS (aa 1120-1124). Caspase-3 cleaves RFC-1 into 97, 73 and 65 kDa fragments during apoptosis. There is one potential alternative start site at Met117. Over aa 800-1093, human RFC1 shares 90% aa identity with mouse RFC1.
