BACKGROUND

Placenta growth factor (PIGF) is a member of the vascular endothelial growth factor (VEGF) family of growth factors. As a result of alternative splicing, at least two PIGF mRNAs encoding monomeric PIGF precursors containing 149 and 170 amino acid residues have been described. The expression of PIGF is not widespread but has been detected in human umbilical vein endothelial cells, placenta, choriocarcinoma cell lines, and in renal cell carcinoma associated with angiogenesis. The PIGF proteins bind with high-affinity to VEGF R1/Flt-1 but not to VEGF R2/Flk-1.

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
