BACKGROUND

HIN-1, also known as secretoglobin 3A1 (SCGB3A1), PnSP-2, LuLeu-2, and UGRP-2 is an 8 kDa member of the secretoglobins family of molecules. It is synthesized as a 104 aa precursor that contains a 21 aa signal sequence and an 83 aa mature region. Based on other members of the family, HIN-1 is likely to exist as a disulfide-linked homodimer. The molecule is found in mammary and upper airway epithelium. No receptor for HIN-1 has been identified. Mature mouse HIN-1 shares 60% aa sequence identity with mature human HIN-1.

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
