BACKGROUND

BACE-2 (β-site APP cleaving enzyme 2; also Asp-1 and Memapsin-1) is a 73-75 kDa member of the peptidase A1 family. It is expressed both in- and outside the CNS, and is classified as a Golgi aspartyl protease. Its status as a β-secretase is unclear; if it has physiological activity, it may be associated with glia. Mature BACE-2 is a 456 amino acid (aa) type I transmembrane glycoprotein. It contains a 411 aa extracellular domain (aa 63-473) that has two catalytic residues (Asp93 and Asp289). Two potential splice forms exist; one shows a deletion of aa 329-378, while a second shows an 18 aa substitution for aa 380-518. Over aa 63-466, human BACE-2 shares 92% aa sequence identity with mouse BACE-2.
