BACKGROUND

Prostatin, also known as Prss8 and channel activating protease 1, is a 40 kDa serine protease with trypsin-like substrate specificity that is a member of the peptidase S1 family. The enzyme is synthesized from a 343 amino acid (aa) preproenzyme that contains a 29 aa signal peptide, a propeptide (aa 30-32) and a 290 aa mature chain. A second propeptide (aa 323-343) contains a 21 aa transmembrane region (GPI anchor) which can be proteolytically processed to generate a secreted form of the enzyme. The mature chain forms a heterodimer made up of a light chain (aa 33-44) and a heavy chain (aa 45-322) that are connected by disulfide bonds. In addition, aa 45-286 constitute a peptidase S1 domain, and aa 159 is a potential site for N-linked glycosylation. Mature human Prostatin is 79% and 78% aa identical to mature mouse and rat Prostatin, respectively. Prostatin is highly expressed in the prostate gland, and is expressed at lower levels in the lung, kidney, salivary gland, and pancreas. It activates amiloride-sensitive sodium channels.

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
