BACKGROUND

Orexin R2 (Orexin Receptor 2), also known as HCRT2 (Hypocretin Receptor 2) or OX2R is a 40 kDa 7-transmembrane G-protein-coupled glycoprotein that is a high affinity receptor for orexins A and B (hypocretins 1 and 2). In mouse brain, engagement of Orexin Rs/HCRTs promotes wakefulness, such that absence of either orexins or their receptors creates a narcolepsy-like state. It also influences reward circuits involving food or addictive drugs. The extracellular portions of human Orexin R2/HCRT2 share 92% and 93% aa identity with corresponding portions of mouse and rat Orexin R2/HCRT2, respectively.

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
