BACKGROUND

O-Glucosyltransferase1 (POGLUT1) is a homologue of Rumi from Drosophila, an endoplasmic reticulum (ER)-retaining glucosyltransferase, that adds glucose to serine residues within the consensus sequence of C1-X-S-X-P-C2 in Notch EGF repeats, thereby regulating cell-fate decisions (1). It is also known as CAP10-like protein (2) and KTELC1 due to the highly conserved CAP10 domain and the presence of an ER-retaining motif, KTEL, at the C-terminus. The human gene is reported to be involved in the pathogenesis of both acute myelogenous and T-acute lymphoblastic leukemias (3). POGLUT1 has hydrolase activity on UDP-Glc in a phosphatase-coupled glycosyltransferase assay (4).

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
