BACKGROUND

The active form of TGF-β3 is a disulfide-linked homodimer which is generated by activation of the latent TGF-β3 complex. TGF-βs are multifunctional cytokines that activate or repress multiple genes in a wide variety of cell types. Depending on the cell context, TGF-β can control many cellular processes including growth, morphogenesis, and apoptosis.

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
